

International Connection Programme 2024/25

Objectives

Cross-cultural Peer Mentorship

- To establish supportive networks that can provide assistance in both academic and personal life aspects.
- To enhance the seamless transition and life adjustment of new students at CUHK.

Global Leadership

• To develop students' global leadership skills, event management and cross-cultural communication skills, which are essential for global leaders.

Cultural Integration

To facilitate meaningful intercultural integration between local and non-local students.

Eligibility

Mentors

• All full-time Year 2-or-above UG students at CUHK are eligible to apply. Priority will be given to year 3 or above students. Interviews may be required if necessary.

Mentees

• All the full-time Year 1 UG students at CUHK are eligible to apply.

Matching

One mentor will be matched up with one mentee. **Each mentorship group will consist of both local and non-local students.** Matching will be conducted based on factors such as personal interests, major, affiliated college.

Training Sessions

Each mentor or mentee is required to attend the Meet-up Session and two workshops out of the three:

Bonding Activities

The mentor and mentee in each mentoring group are expected to strengthen their bond by participating in at least 2 activities together throughout the academic year. They can be self-initiated social gatherings or activities organized by our office.

Cultural Activities

The mentoring groups will be divided into 6 to 8 teams, with each team consisting of approximately 20 students (both mentors and mentees). Each team will be expected to work together to organize a cultural activity for all the participants of this programme. One advisor will be allocated to each team to provide guidance throughout the activity planning and execution process.

Format: A diverse range of cultural elements will be encouraged, such as hands-on workshops (e.g., art, crafts, cuisine), interactive cultural activities, and informative sharing sessions.

Scope: 20-50 participants per activity

Financial Subsidy: Each cultural activity will receive a subsidy of up to \$8,000.

After the implementation of activities, all teams will be invited to present their work at the final Presentation Session. The panel will select the best team, which will be fully subsidized to go on a tour to Singapore.

Certification and Prize

- Student Development Portfolio (SDP) record update
- Certificate of Participation (Requirement: attendance in at least two training sessions, as well as completion of at least two bonding activities)
- Full subsidy on participation in an overseas cultural tour awarded to the winning team only
